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### LOGLINE

She glows indigo. She levitates. She brings the dying back from the edge. A teenage girl reincarnates as the prophesied Goddess; a superhero destined to save the world, but to fulfill this ancient prophecy and awaken her cosmic healing power, she must undergo a perilous metamorphosis on a heroic, superhuman journey to the highest place on Earth.

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### THE STORY

Hidden deep in the mountains where India, Tibet, and China converge stands Mt. Kailash – the mythical “Healing Mountain.” For centuries, a secret order of monks has guarded a prophecy foretelling the reincarnation of the Buddha Goddess, a divine healer destined to save a fractured world. In America, seventeen-year-old Rebecca Shay – born nearly strangled by her umbilical cord, her skin briefly glowing blue – an earthly sign of divine rebirth – grows up unaware of her destiny. She struggles to understand the strange power awakening within her, until a public eruption shatters her ordinary life.

When Rebecca publicly levitates and revives dead butterflies in her science class, the footage goes viral, transforming her into the global phenomenon known as “Blue Girl.” After she miraculously heals her crush from a fatal heart condition, millions seek her salvation. But Rebecca can heal only one person at a time, and as people die waiting, the mashing weight of expectation pushes her to the brink. Her secret guardian, Narayan, reveals the truth: the only way to heal the world is for Rebecca to ascend Mt. Kailash, a journey no one has survived and fully awaken the Goddess within her.

Rebecca escapes to the mountain and begins the deadly ascent as Narayan sacrifices his life to protect her. Alone and near death, she reaches the sacred summit at sunrise, where celestial forces align and she merges with the cosmic spirit of the Buddha Goddess. A radiant blue energy blankets the Earth, spreading healing beyond her alone. When the light fades, Rebecca is mortal once more – but healing is no longer hers alone. Humanity now carries the fragile hope she unlocked, and the fate of the world rests in what they choose to do with it.
